New Generation Servo Take Out Arms

Since the introduction by Lattimer of the Belt Driven Take Out Arms, Lattimer have led the way in take out arm design. We have now applied that expertise to the Take Out Arms used on servo machines.



All the new Lattimer Servo Take Out Arms have cases manufactured from aluminium billet, reducing the lead time to manufacture. The range of Arms are constructed to be as maintenance friendly as all Lattimer arms, and so all wear parts are easily replaceable.

Taper roller bearings are used to ensure the drive shaft is held rigidly in the casing preventing any lateral movement of the shaft that could result in failure. A combination of needle and roller bearings provide additional support for all rotating parts and guarantee their smooth operation. The Arm is also fitted with a mechanical

stop to enable a speedy re datuming of the machine following a crash, as well as facility to check the belt tension without requiring any dismantling of the case and cover.

All new Lattimer Servo arms now utilise the same internal components reducing the number of part numbers that need to be held in stock and all are available with belt and chain drive.

NECK RING MECHANISM ASSEMBLY RELOCATION

A reorganisation of the shop floor to further increase efficiency in the Turning department has provided us with an opportunity to relocate and expand our Neck Ring Mechanism assembly and test area.

Since we introduced a dedicated area for the assembly of our market leading Neck Ring Mechanism demand has continued to grow and so we now need to further increase our manufacturing capacity of this product and have taken the opportunity to relocate into a larger area with the possibility of increasing capacity even further in the future.



NEW ADJUSTABLE TONG HEAD

Lattimer have been developing an adjustable Tong Head which enables the centre distance between containers in a triple gob arrangement to be varied between pick up at the mould, and depositing on the dead plate for transfer onto the cross conveyor, making greater use of the limited space available on the conveyor and reducing the speed it would need to operate.



As you would expect he Lattimer design has a number of significant improvements over other similar products on the market.

The guide bars are of a common, large diameter and have been positioned equi distant from the actuator pivot, reducing the forces required to move the tong holders and increasing the rigidity of the assembly for a smooth operation and repeatable positioning.

The bearings allowing the Tong heads to move freely are protected by seals, preventing ingress of foreign bodies that result in seizure, O rings are used to prevent air leakage.

The Tong head body is manufactured from aluminium billet, the profile has been created to be light yet rigid, preventing distortion during operation.

The number of components has been kept to a minimum reducing the stock holding and costs.

New Changing Facilities

Over the summer shutdown we have undertaken a major change to the changing facilities in the Lattimer Plant. Constructing a dedicated changing area with new larger lockers, seating, improved LED lighting and ventilation.

The new locker room is located in the same area as used previously but a full repainting of the walls and floor prior to the installation of the new facilities has completely changed the area, providing our workforce with the facilities they deserve.

The work was undertaken without issue on a very tight schedule by D Parr Construction who has done a number of projects on the site, ensuring it was ready to use immediately following the two week summer shutdown period.



Plastic Packaging Reduction

With the worlds focus on reducing the consumption of Plastic, Lattimer's Despatch team led by Ethan Fletcher have been doing their bit to reduce our plastic footprint.



The despatch team have been working very hard to find alternatives to plastic packaging materials used extensively in the engineering industry.

Over 95% of the packaging now used at Lattimer is manufactured from recycled paper and cardboard. We use paper tape, paper and card bubble wrap, paper bags, a wide variety of cardboard boxes in different sizes with shredded paper and cardboard used to prevent product moving in transit.

Well done Ethan for sourcing all the materials, now for the final 5%.
